- Advance governance and social policy, including anti-corruption and poverty reduction; and
- Strengthen institutional relevance and policy coordination.

The programme is designed for emerging leaders and mid-level professionals, particularly those in strategic and non-technical roles related to policy development within their respective organizations. It aims to strengthen the capacity of Sri Lankan professionals to lead change, foster innovation, and drive institutional improvement, thereby contributing to sustainable national development.

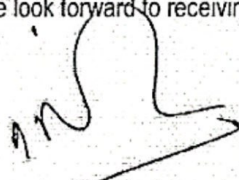
1. Nomination letter from the Ministry;
